




Location Map – Accomack County









Project Purpose & Need

- ✓ Improve safety through the construction of a new vehicle bridge, replacing the existing one, on Route 178 (Shields Bridge Road) over Occohannock Creek.
- ✓ Shorten duration of construction through full closure.




Traffic Operations

| Traffic Volume (vehicles per day) | 2019 | 2044 |
|-----------------------------------|-------|-------|
| Route 178 (Shields Bridge Road) | 1,600 | 1,950 |

- Current size of Route 178 Bridge over Occohannock Creek can accommodate future traffic demand.
- No capacity expansion is needed in new bridge structure.




Design Approach - Plan View

Key Elements: 1) Bridge – increased clearances, 2) Sheetpile wall – minimize impacts, 3) Roadway transition – tie bridge to road, 4) Guardrail – similar layout to existing, 5) Temporary easements to facilitate construction








UPDATED PROPOSED DESIGN

Approach Roadway - Typical Section










Utility Impacts

Known utility owners within the project area include:

- A&N Electric (electric)
- Verizon (telecom)
- **Charter Spectrum (telecom)**
- 2 of these transverse using overhead poles, 1 attached to bridge

VDOT's Right of Way and Utilities team will identify and address utility relocations prior to construction with appropriate agency.

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Environmental Overview

Section 106 (Archeological Resources/Historic Resources)

The Project will have no effect on historic resources.

Natural Resources – Threatened & Endangered Species

 The Project proposed minimal tree clearing and would not be anticipated to result in significant impacts to roosting habitat for the Federally threatened Northern Long-eared Bat. No time-of-the-year restriction for tree clearing or in-water work are anticipated for the Project.

Water Quality Resources – Water Quality Permits

Due to the minor wetland and in-water impacts, the Project would qualify for U.S.
 Army Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit 14 for road crossing and Virginia
 Marine Resources Commission General Permit 1. Permits would be required
 during the final design phase of the project.



Environmental Overview

Hazardous Materials

The Project will not have an adverse effect associated with hazardous materials.

Other Environmental Resources

 The project will **not** involve any impacts to Section 4(f), Section 6(f), low-income and minority communities (Environmental Justice), air and noise. There will be no displacement of businesses and residential homes.

Programmatic Categorical Agreement (PCE)

The project is federally eligible with very minimum environmental impacts.
 Therefore, a PCE was completed for this project.



Environmental Overview

Project will <u>not</u> individually or cumulatively have significant environmental impacts to require an Environmental Assessment or Environmental Impact Statement.

Project qualifies for a **Programmatic Categorical Exclusion (PCE)** level of

NEPA documentation under 23 CFR 771.117.

PCE was prepared and approved by the Federal Highway Administration on July 15, 2019.





Proposed Right of Way (ROW)

➤ There will be no fee acquisitions proposed. All work will be performed within the existing right of way.


➤ Temporary construction easements will be sought from numerous properties along the east and west sides of the project for access and utility work.



Right of Way (ROW) Acquisition Information

- To provide uniform and equitable treatment for persons affected by a project, Congress passed the Uniform Relocations Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 and amended it in 1987.
- This law, called the *Uniform Act*, is the foundation for the information discussed in this brochure.


Anticipated Project Costs

| Phase | Cost |

| Right of Way (RW) | \$500,000 |
| Construction (CN) | \$4,800,000 |

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
